

2017 Denton Historic Home Tour, Saturday, December 2, 2017



The Home Tour begins to highlight all the historic homes in our region - between Panhandle south to West Hickory and Carroll Blvd westward to Bonnie Brae.

Seven homes in the historic neighborhoods between the Downtown Square and the UNT campus:

- 1109 Congress –Home of Natalee and John Warren
- 1019 Egan – Home of Emily and Hayden Mooney
- 1401 Egan – Home of Michelle Lynn
- 612 Pearl – Home of Lynde and Jamie Oswold
- 616 W. Oak – Home of Maya and Pete Leptuch
- 619 W. Oak – Home of Erika and Jeff Wegenka
- 1914 W. Oak – Home of Paul Meltzer

The warm glow of street lamps enhances safety, ambiance, and walks to Denton’s Square. Our communities in the historic residential areas between the Square and UNT started a project four years ago to “light the way” for safe travel along West Oak and West Hickory Streets to connect the downtown Square with neighborhoods and the UNT campus. The addition of 36 historic-style street lamps to date is an on-going project of Historic Denton, Inc., a 501c3 nonprofit, with current focus on West Hickory Street, followed with other connection streets.

In our collaboration with Denton Municipal Electric (DME), our neighborhoods fund street lamps, costing \$2,000 per pole, and DME provides installation and maintenance. To support this community project, we began the Historic Denton Home Tour on the first Saturday of December.
