Chef McGrady enjoyed his time cooking for Diana and her sons. He knew that Diana was making a big difference with her influence/charity in all peoples' lives and he said she was on the right track in her life once she overcame the bulimia. He gave a funny comparison of the complication for Prince William to get a dish of chocolate ice cream while visiting his Grandmother the Queen at Buckingham Palace as opposed to how he helped himself at home in Kensington Palace.
