The general membership luncheon meeting was held on Monday, August 7, 2017 at the clubhouse.

President Sharon Foy reported for Service Chairperson Judy Ondina that the July donation to Denton Community Food Center totaled \$872. In addition to a large number of backpacks and a mountain of school supplies, \$389 was donated to Friends of the Family this month.

Randi Skinner, Director of Marketing and Development for the Friends of the Family, said that the organization's goal was to raise a total of 400 backpacks, and that they needed 50 more to meet that goal. Thanks to the Robson Ranch Women's Club that goal would be exceeded. She shared that just last month there were 235 new clients including 101 children. Sharon reported for Welcome Committee Chairperson B.J. Watson that in the month of June there were 15 new home sales, 1 resale, and 2 new renters for a total of 18.

Special Projects Chairperson Peggy Crandell informed the group that tickets for the tea would be available at the exit table after the meeting. She shared some intriguing table decoration titles such as Midnight at the Oasis, Hats Off to Royalty, Springtime in Paris, and Afternoon Tea in Tuscany. Every table has a different theme.
